


## SECTOR AT-A-GLANCE




Charities are either charitable organizations, private foundations or public foundations. They are federally registered with the Canada Revenue Agency and must provide a benefit to the community. Charities are tax-exempt and may issue tax receipts for donations.


Incorporated nonprofits can be registered federally or provincially according to the terms of the applicable legislation. Depending on the structure of the organization, a head office can be incorporated federally with regional branches incorporated provincially. Nonprofits also include member-benefitting organizations such as labour unions and professional associations.

Unincorporated groups include coalitions, seasonal events committees, sport groups, neighbourhood arts troupes, and environmental organizations. They may evolve to address short-term or one-off issues. This part of the sector is difficult to track as there are no reporting requirements in place for these groups.


## Size of Charities by Annual Revenue

Capturing the true number of nonprofits is difficult as new organizations continuously emerge, evolve, incorporate or register and fold.
